**1. Title of Practice - “Nurturing and fostering female students of the college”**

**2. Objectives of Practice –**

- To achieve gender equality
- To create gender sensitization through curricular and extracurricular activities
- To foster women's empowerment and create leadership quality through workshops, surveys and training program
- To provide hands-on training in Self-defense to girls to protect themselves.
- To encourage female students belonging to weaker sections of society

**3. The Context –**

Women in India are suffering from some constraints in the form of gender inequality, domestic violence, secondary treatment, etc. However, due to the increasing literacy rate, equal treatment to the girl child and a growing trend towards girls' education is observed. The number of female students enrolled for the undergraduate courses has been consistently increasing than the male students in the college. A conducive college environment plays a very important role in the overall personality development of female students.

**4. The Practice –**

To nurture and foster female students following activities were conducted by the college:

- Guest lectures were organized for female students by the Women Development Cell.
- A separate gymnasium is set up for female students.
- Girl students were encouraged to participate in various sports and cultural activities.
- DLLE has selected the project topic “Status of Women in Society (SWS)” to create awareness among students about women-related issues in Indian society.

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- Female students have been responsible for acting as heads of the various committees.

#### **5. Evidence of Success –**

- 27 female students have completed the DLLE project named Status of Women in Indian Society.

- Ms. Prerana Utekar won 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in a game zone event organized by BMN College of Home Science, Matunga.
