Aug-2025: Slight dip to 1,006	Sep-2025: Further rise to 1,183 (highest)


Pattern: After orientation / semester start, usage surged. September shows maximum borrowing activity.

- Consistent Growth: Logins and Issues show strong upward trend → Students are increasingly dependent on library resources.
- **Balanced Circulation:** Returns are almost equal to issues each month, reflecting a healthy circulation cycle.
